

## PROSPECTUS:

### 2018 Women in Neuroradiology Leadership Award

#### DESCRIPTION

In 2012, the Foundation of the American Society of Neuroradiology (Foundation), American College of Radiology (ACR), and American Association for Women Radiologists (AAWR) established an award to provide leadership opportunities for women in Neuroradiology. Since neuroradiologists must be leaders in the field, this award is for **mid-career women** with demonstrated experience and promise for leadership in Neuroradiology. The objectives are to provide the award recipient with additional skills and insights to enhance opportunities for advancement.

The award recipient will receive funding to cover tuition and transportation costs to attend the **ACR 2018 Radiology Leadership Institute Summit** in conjunction with Babson College in Wellesley, Massachusetts, to be held at the **Babson Executive Conference Center, September 7-9, 2018**. All other expenditures will be at the expense of the award recipient. #### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must have a MD degree or DO degree, plus subspecialty certification in Neuroradiology, or its equivalent for International candidates. Applicants must have demonstrated experience and promise for leadership in neuroradiology and must be a current member in good standing of ASNR, ACR, and AAWR. Strong consideration will be given to applicants from practices and institutions that show a commitment to the applicant's career development.

#### APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

All applications should include (*applications will only be accepted electronically; no hard copy documents by mail or fax will be accepted*):

- A. Completed application form
- B. Current curriculum vitae
- C. Statement from the applicant that describes the applicant's involvement within ASNR, ACR, and/or AAWR (e.g. committee service, past awards/honors received, etc.), qualifications, professional aspirations, and goals for attending the 2018 ACR Leadership Institute Summit (in addition to Career Goals and Objectives).
- D. Two (2) letters of support from academic chair or practice leader and from a leader outside of the applicant's department or practice but relevant to leadership area of interest.
- E. **Deadline for receipt of applications and required documentation is 9:00 AM Central Standard Time (CST), Monday, April 16, 2018.** Late applications will not be accepted. Applications and required documentation must be submitted electronically (in .pdf or .doc format) to **Theresa Espinosa at [tespinosa@asnr.org](mailto:tespinosa@asnr.org)**. On the subject line, indicate *Women in Neuroradiology Leadership Award*.

#### AWARD SELECTION PROCESS

- A. Selection of the award recipient will be in May 2018, with subsequent notification of the award recipient. All those with interest in the award, or employees of an institution that may be involved in the award, shall recuse themselves from the selection process.
- B. Announcement of the award will be made on the ASNR website and at the ASNR 57th Annual Meeting, Boston, Massachusetts, in May 2019.

## **METHOD OF NOMINATION**

- A. Award will be designated and administered by The Foundation of the American Society of Neuroradiology.
- B. The Review Committee will provide review and recommendations to the Foundation/ACR/AAWR for the award.

## **POST RADIOLOGY LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE SUMMIT**

Within six (6) months of attending the 2018 ACR Radiology Leadership Institute, the award recipient must submit a brief written summary detailing how attending the Leadership Institute Summit assisted in their professional development, insights gained, etc. *Summaries may be published on the Foundation of the ASNR website and in other promotional communications.*
